# Parent Support



## Before class meeting starts

Help your child wake up and eat before class.



## During our meeting

You should not have to stay next to your child during the entire class. Be close in case technical help is needed.

## After our meeting

Set up regular break times for eating and movement.



Make sure your child has school materials ready when class starts.



Remember the camera and microphone are on during our meeting. Monitor your home for excessive noise and inappropriate clothes.

Help your child complete the work assigned and turn it in. Please do not do the work yourself! If the work is confusing, check in during office hours.

You will need to help your child log in to class for the first several meetings.
