
Thunderbird Update – August 20, 2020

Dear Families,

I wanted to update you on an important change to our calendar and our distribution plan for materials. We have moved our virtual back-to-school night live question and answer session with teachers to August 31st from 5:30 to 6:30 pm. The change in date is to accommodate our





- 1. You and your child get to meet with the teacher.
- 2. You will take a first day of school picture.
- 3. Your child will receive a "learning kit".
- 4. Your child will receive a learning device.
- 5. The teacher will teach your child how to log into learning.
- 6. Other activities that are appropriate for your child's grade level.

We expect that following during this time:

- 1. The 3 W's are adhered to:
 - a. All must WEAR a mask (with the exception of those under 2).
 - b. Watch your distance and respect the 6 ft distance edict for other families
 - c. Wash your hands before and after your visit. We will have hand sanitizing stations ready.
- Siblings are kept under the control of the parent and are not allowed to wander the room. We have worked hard to sanitize and create safe environments. Please help us maintain your safety, your children's' safety, and ours.

We have included a revised copy of the Master Remote Learning Schedule in today's newsletter. Please replace this schedule with the one sent out earlier.




Early Childhood and Early Childhood PSD Virtual laptop pick-up - Aug. 26-27

For students enrolled in PSD preschool and Early Childhood PSD Virtual, families in need of technology will come to Fullana Learning Center, 220 N. Grant Ave. in Fort Collins, to pick up their device from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Aug. 26-27. Come to the east side of the building from Loomis Avenue.

PSD Virtual laptop pick-up

The district has set August 21st from 8:00 am to 11:00 am for laptop pick-up for our students who have enrolled in PSD Virtual. PSD Virtual families whose home school is Johnson – will receive a separate communication with additional details on this distribution event.

School donation requests

Below are a couple of items we are requesting donations for that are now visible in SchoolPay for parents to see. We prefer to take all donations through SchoolPay rather than receiving cash or check at this time. Click here to learn more about SchoolPay. Pay Fees/Charges Online

- Johnson Supplies: Kindergarten 5th Grade 2020-21
 \$20 to cover all or a portion of the cost of purchasing expendable supplies to be used by all students for literacy, math, social studies, science, and craft activities. Waivers are not applicable; students will have access to the supplies regardless of whether payment is made. For families with more than one child enrolled at Johnson we would only ask for one donation of \$20.
- Johnson Student Planner: 4th & 5th Grade 2020-21 \$4 To cover all or a portion of the cost of the planners. Waviers are not applicable; all students will receive a planner regardless of whether payment is made.

Using the ParentVUE, StudentVUE portals

The <u>Synergy ParentVUE portal</u> gives parents and guardians web and mobile access to permission to share and other forms, assessments, report cards and class schedules when available. Earlier this summer, parents should have received instructions on accessing ParentVUE accounts for both new and existing users. Where PSD students can get meals during remote education

PSD will provide sack breakfasts and lunches for any enrolled PSD students Monday-Friday starting Aug. 24 at 18 schools and more than 60 mobile-serving locations across the district. Students who qualify for free and reduced-price lunch will receive either meal at no cost; paying students will be charged the normal breakfast and lunch cost to their meal account. More info >>



Free and reduced-price meals and fee waivers

If your child is eligible for free or reduced-price meals in PSD, you may also be able to take advantage of another fantastic benefit: waivers from some school fees and charges.

- Step 1 Fill out the <u>free and reduced-price meal online application</u> (or you may pick up an application at PSD's Child Nutrition office, 1502 S. Timberline Road in Fort Collins). Your child's free/reduced meal eligibility status is confidential. <u>More info >></u>
- Step 1 Once approved for free or reduce-price meals, complete PSD's Permission to Share Information
 for Fee Waivers and Programs to Receive Goods and Services form, available online in <u>ParentVUE</u>.
 Completing the form gives PSD's Child Nutrition Department permission to share your child's eligibility

Review the PSD Student Rights and Code of Conduct

Each year, parents/guardians and secondary students must acknowledge that they have_reviewed the Student Rights and Code of Conduct, a compilation of rules, policies and regulations regarding student behavior.

Dear Johnson Families:

Thank you for your continued support as we work diligently to define what remote learning will look like for you children. We are on day four of teachers being back on duty, but many have come in early to complete launch learning training, think about creative ways to connect with your children, and get ready for the challenge ahead. These first three days have brought working in teams to craft our master remote schedule. You will find this attached. To define what our remote learning looks like, we have an explanation of the types of learning your children will engage in.

- Teachers will support remote student learning through a blending of three models:
 - Synchronous (real-time) learning: Online learning in which teachers and students participate at the same time, but not in the same place. Synchronous learning is delivered through a virtual meeting platform.
 - o Asynchronous (any-time) Learning: Online learning in which students learn at different times and locations. Asynchronous learning is often supported by posted media materials.
 - Activities that support student learning. Independent practice may include reading assignments, general practice, homework, and projects.
- All lessons will be based on essential standards and provide meaningful work. Over the course of the year, all essential standards will be covered in core subject areas and courses.

Monday – Thursday: Johnson Master Schedule: Please see attached schedule

<u>Fridays:</u> All students will have a live morning meeting from 8:50-9:15 am, then students will engage in independent and asynchronous work. Teachers will communicate their office hours on Fridays so that they can support students and families.

Teachers may make small adjustments in time and will be communicating to families their synchronous and asynchronous times during their literacy, math, and SS/Science times. Note that all synchronous lessons will be recorded; so, if students miss a session, they can go back and watch the lesson. We are taking attendance and hope that all students can attend lessons when they are live if possible. When you read our master schedule, those areas highlighted in peach are synchronous lessons, and those highlighted in green are asynchronous. The small group blue areas could be synchronous or asynchronous depending on students' needs. Please note that all Specials times will have a synchronous component. Each classroom will have Art, Music, Physical Education, and Counseling each week.

Please watch for more information this week about student remote learning expectations and family expectations. We are developing these in the spirit of what would be most supportive of families within the challenges we face as a school.

Parent communication from Johnson
