Dear Johnson Families,

Please take a few minutes to read through today's news update. We have been open for in-person learning for a little over 5 weeks! Thank you for helping us stay open!

Here is what we expect of families to help our school stay open:

- Complete symptom checks for your children every day. If your child is experiencing <u>any</u> of the symptoms listed, keep your child home: <u>Can I go to school today?</u>
- Reinforce the safety measures we put in place at school.
- Help your children to understand this will pass, and we hope to return to "normalcy" as soon as possible.
- Provide your children with a mask and teach them how to wear and care for masks. The mask should fit snuggly.
- Remind your children to wash their hands frequently.
- Communicate with us about cases and potential exposures (970-488-5000).

Outdoor Recess Guidelines

As a gentle reminder, Colorado brings ever changing weather. Please make sure your child brings the appropriate gear to go out and play. The children love playing in the snow at recess and have such a great time with this. Our temperature cut point for going out is 10°. We do watch for windchill and factor this in. In other words, if the temperature is 20° but windchill says it feels like 7°, we keep the children inside.
