## An Olympic Event Metaphor

What a special summertime treat it is when the Olympic Games dominate the TV channels. The stories of effort and triumph are always so inspiring. This year, one of my favorite events to watch was the Canoe Slalom event. In this event, athletes are challenged to maneuver their canoes through a fast moving, down-river slalom course. They use incredible muscle power, technique, skills, balance, and tenacity to overcome the strong flow and currents to correctly complete the course, which is based on getting their boats and bodies between several gates placed throughout the fun ride. What a great metaphor this white-water event is for the journey of learning – sometimes learning is free flowing, fun, and easy, and then suddenly learning makes us paddle harder to get through all the gates of academic, creative, social, and physical learning targets. Johnson's staff are focused on building students' school muscles, and to teaching the techniques and skills needed for students to make it through all the learning gates (learning standards). ## PBIS

PBIS stands for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports and is a school-wide approach to teaching evidence-based behavior expectations that build a healthy school climate and increase academic success for all students. 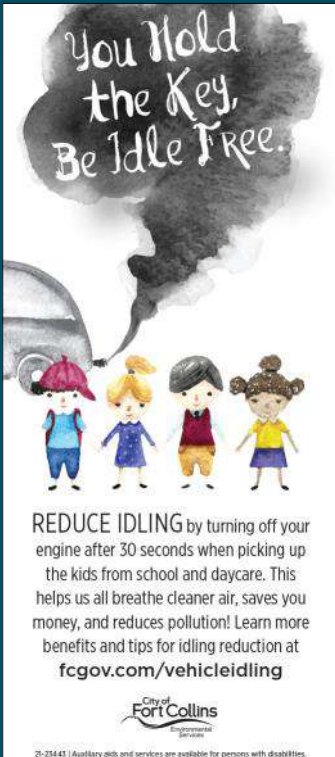

## School Supply List

## First Day of School

The first day of school for students in 1<sup>st</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade is Monday, August 16<sup>th</sup>. School hours are 8:50 a.m. to 3:28 p.m.

Kindergarten students will have intake testing on August 16 and 17, and staggered start on August 18 and 19. Kindergarten families will receive a letter from your child's teacher with detailed information on the opening schedule.

Pre-School students begin on Monday, August 23<sup>rd</sup> and parents will receive information directly from your child's pre-school teacher.

## Class Lists/Teacher Assignment

We know students are excited to know who their teacher and classmates will be! Class lists will be posted on the main doors at Johnson on Friday, August 13<sup>th</sup> by 10:00 a.m. Parents may also look for your child's teacher assignment through [ParentVUE](#) on this date.

**Once these lists are posted, they do not change.** Administration, classroom teachers, support staff, and specials teachers all work diligently to place your child in a balanced classroom in which he/she will be successful. We consider a multitude of factors including but not limited to friendships, gender, academic needs/strengths, gifts and talents, learning styles, social/emotional needs, and more. Moving a student from one classroom to another classroom after all these considerations are made unravels this thoughtful work and has a ripple effect for other students. This is why: **Once these lists are posted, they do not change.**

## ParentVUE

Parents/guardians can access grades, attendance, schedules, and other student information through the Synergy parent portal. Complete secure logon through the [ParentVUE/StudentVUE portal](#) or through the apps, which can be downloaded from the [iTunes Store](#) and [Google Play](#).

Parents/guardians can only see their student's information. Parents/guardians must have "educational rights" to access ParentVUE. Once educational rights are reflected in Synergy, parents will receive an email with a user activation code.


