



Applications for the 2021-22 school year are no longer being accepted. The school transfer process must be used for the remainder of this school year.

The 2022-2023 school choice application window opened on Friday, Oct. 1.

- Please note the order in which applications are received during the first consideration application period do not affect a student's acceptance.
- The first-consideration application period closes at noon, Friday, Jan. 21.
- New and currently enrolled students who wish to enroll or return to their neighborhood school for the following school year <u>do not need to</u> <u>submit a School Choice Application</u>. Please contact the neighborhood school directly to enroll the student for the following school year.

Math Olympiads for 5th Grade Students

We will be launching *Math Olympiads*, every Thursday (starting Thursday, October 21st) from 3:30 – 4:30 p.m., in the Media Center.



Created in 1977 by Dr. George Lenchner, an internationally known math educator, the Math Olympiads went public in 1979. Last year nearly 170,000 students from over 6,000 teams worldwide participated in the Olympiads. All 50 states and about 35 other countries were represented.

During this afterschool enrichment, students will practice and prepare for <u>contests</u>, using non-routine problems that support higher level thinking. From November to March, students will participate in five challenging monthly contests. <u>No traveling is required</u>. These contests provide an incentive for students to intensify their study of math.

During our afterschool sessions in October, we will give our "Mathletes" strategies and instructions for the monthly contests. Following each contest, we'll break down and discuss solution methods together for each problem that was presented. Our main goals are as follows:

Attendance and Absence Reporting

If your student is ill, they should not come to school.

If your child will be absent or tardy, please call our school attendance line at 970-488-5095. Be prepared to answer the following questions:

- 1. Give your students First and Last Name, Grade and Teacher
- 2. Reason for Absence
- 3. If your child is ill, is he/she experiencing any of these COVID-like symptoms:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell, OR
 - Sore throat

Please leave a detailed message about your child's symptoms, information about any possible exposure to a COVID-19 case, and your phone number to receive a call back from our health office staff.

Hours of operation
