Welcome to November! We had a busy October with a return to as much normalcy as possible. Some celebrations from October are:


- 1. Meeting our Raise Craze goals both in acts of kindness AND funds for school programming.

#### In Case you Missed it & Monthy Reminders

#### PSD Lockdown Drill Week set for Nov. 1-5

During the week of Nov. 1-5, all Poudre School District schools will participate in lockdown drills. The following is what you can expect:

 We know we will participate in a drill that week but won't know the specific time at which it will occur.



- We will make an announcement over our intercom when the drill is underway and emphasize that it is only a drill and that there is not an active threat to our school.
- During a lockdown drill, students and staff are directed to a safe location inside the building. Exterior and interior doors, windows, and access points are closed and locked. Due to COVID protocols, students will remain at their desks or normal socially distanced positions during the drill.
- When it's completed, school staff, members of PSD's Safety and Security Department, and law enforcement officers will review how things went.
- Community members can expect to see a heavier-than-usual law enforcement presence at the schools when lockdown drills occur.

#### **Student Data Verification**

We encourage parent/guardians to review and/or update their family and student information. Up to date contact information is important in order to receive communication from Johnson and Poudre School District. Updates can now be completed through <a href="ParentVUE">ParentVUE</a>. Once you log into ParentVUE, click on the Online Registration tab on the top right corner of the screen:



Then, select 2021-2022 Family and Student Data Verification from the drop-down menu:



If applicable, parents can upload a proof of address and updated immunization record.

Please contact our office at 970-488-5000 if you have any questions, or need a hard copy of the student verification form sent home.

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#### **Important Reminder RE: Health Protocols**

Please help us keep our classrooms open for inperson learning by keeping children home if they are not feeling well. We ask that you screen your child for symptoms prior to sending him/ her to school each day: Can I go to school symptom check

PSD strictly adheres to the state's <u>Return to Learn guidelines</u>. If symptoms begin, we encourage you to be tested for COVID-19. Please notify us immediately at (970-488-5000) if any member of your household tests positive.

#### **COVID Protocols for Volunteers**

We are so thankful for our many volunteers here at Johnson. If you are interested in volunteering, visit the <u>PSD Volunteer Website</u> and register to be a volunteer in PSD. Once you are approved, check with your child's teacher for volunteer opportunities.

**COVID** protocols in PSD for Volunteers

- 1. **Masks are required for all volunteers and visitors** to PSD schools and buildings. Masks are not required outside.
- 2. **Self-monitoring for symptoms** is required before entering a building.
- 3. Log into the PSD Community Portal when you volunteer or visit.
- 4. Then scan your badge or log in to volunteer.

Volunteer opportunities at schools may be designed to limit the potential for close contact as much as possible.

#### Reporting if you are exposed to or have COVID

If you volunteer and experience one of the following, please report it to the school as quickly as possible so the COVID Response Team can follow district protocols for cases:

- You are identified as a close contact of an individual who tested positive or probable for COVID-19, or
- You test positive for or are considered probable for COVID-19 yourself.

The purpose of the handbook is to provide information regarding Johnson Elementary School, as well as our school's rules and procedures in an "easy to access" format. We encourage you to read it, keep it on hand to refer to it, and let us know if you need any clarification.

Poudre School District policies and regulations (including but not limited to those in the <u>District's Student Rights & Code of Conduct booklet</u>) also apply to Johnson Elementary School and are controlling over our rules and procedures if there is any inconsistency or conflict. Although this handbook may reference certain District policies and regulations, the actual language of the referenced policies and regulations is controlling over the language in this handbook. District rules and regulations change over time. We will update you as new information becomes available. If you have any questions, feel free to call 488-5000 or visit the main office of Johnson Elementary School.

## Johnson Representative needed for the District Advisory Board

#### **AlphaBEST - Before and After School Childcare**

AlphaBEST Education offers before and after school childcare services to students here at Johnson.

#### **Hours of operation**

- Before-school programs will run 6:30 a.m. until the first bell Mondays through Fridays.
- After-school programs will operate from the time of dismissal until 6 p.m.
- AlphaBEST will align with PSD decisions about opening, delayed start and school closures due to emergencies and inclement weather. AlphaBEST will be closed on most days when PSD is closed. Full-day care will be available at a PSD site on teacher workdays.
