Dear Johnson Families,





#### **Thunderbird PRIDE**

Happy New Year! We are very excited to welcome back students to a new semester of learning in 2022! As we settle back in together, we always like to take some time to remind students of our Thunderbird PRIDE behavior expectations. Please ask your child to tell you what PRIDE stands for, what PRIDE behavior looks like, as well as the different places around the campus where students can show Thunderbird PRIDE every day at Johnson. When students feel proud of their behavior, they can more easily focus on and experience success with their academic and social demands.

This past December, we paid specific attention to PRIDE behavior during lunch time, and students were caught practicing expected Thunderbird behavior over 800 times, which was very encouraging. In January, our focus will be on PRIDE behavior in the hallways (especially during transition times), and all classes will be vying for a chance to get their names listed on a special "Hall of Fame" poster that will be revealed, with some fanfare, in February.

#### Assessments

This month (January 10th-14th), we will be administering Winter MAPs (Measures of Academic Progress) for students in grades 3-5. These important tests in Math and Reading help to measure each student's academic growth throughout the school year and over time. #### **Mobile Bus Vaccine Clinic available at Johnson**

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment is offering several vaccine clinics at PSD locations. Johnson will be one of those locations on <u>Thursday</u>, January 13<sup>th</sup> and again <u>on Thursday</u>, February 3<sup>rd</sup>. PSD is not administering the vaccines or coordinating appointments. Free flu shots are also available at these clinics. Visit <u>PSD's COVID-19 Vaccine</u> <u>website</u> for compete details or to sign-up for an appointment.

#### **Kindergarten Open House and Registration for the 2022-23** school year

Johnson will offer an in-person **Open House/Information Night** for families of incoming Kindergarteners for the 2022-23 school year. Join us on <u>Thursday, January 13<sup>th</sup> from 6 – 7 p.m.</u> <u>in our Gym</u>. This evening is intended for parents/guardians only – please arrange for childcare on this evening. You can view an introductory video on our website as well. We are excited for this night! If you know of a family who has a kindergartener, please reach out to them to let them know about our open house.

Johnson will offer in-person registration for our incoming kindergarten families on <u>Thursday</u>, January 20<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. <u>Online registration</u> is open between January 3<sup>rd</sup> and January 20<sup>th</sup>.

Families must register for kindergarten at their neighborhood school.

- Neighborhood schools and school choice
  - Parents must register their new kindergartner at their neighborhood school, including those who submit school choice applications for kindergarten.
  - Parents who want their child to attend a school outside their attendance/ neighborhood school area must submit a <u>School Choice application</u>.
- Register new kindergarten students online or in-person at schools.
  - To register online, visit the <u>PSD Online Registration web page</u>. Online registration for the 2022-23 school year opens Jan. 3, 2022.
  - ◊ Families can also register in-person at Johnson on January 20<sup>th</sup>. You will need to bring this information to the school:
    - Verification of child's birth date (birth certificate, passport, baptismal certificate, military ID, original or certified copies acceptable).
    - Proof of address (a copy of a lease agreement, mortgage statement, utility bill, etc., that shows that the parent/guardian lives at an address within school boundaries)
    - Immunization record or an <u>immunization exemption form</u>
    - Custody documents (if applicable)

#### I Matter

<u>I Matter</u> - Every Colorado youth is eligible for three free therapy sessions. Youth and their parents can visit the <u>I Matter platform</u> to take a confidential online survey about their mental health and schedule sessions with a licensed behavioral health clinician, primarily online over telehealth. State law allows youth ages 12 and up to use the platform independently; youth ages 11 and younger will need their parent or guardian's consent to sign up. Learn more on the <u>I Matter website</u>.

#### **Important Reminder RE: Health Protocols**

Please help us keep our classrooms open for in-person learning by keeping children home if they are not feeling well. We ask that you screen your child for symptoms prior to sending him/her to school each day: <u>Can I go to school</u> <u>symptom check</u>

PSD strictly adheres to the state's <u>Return to Learn guidelines</u>. If symptoms begin, we encourage you to be tested for COVID-19. Please notify us immediately at (970-488-5000) if any member of your household tests positive.

#### **COVID Protocols for Volunteers**

We are so thankful for our many volunteers here at Johnson. If you are interested in volunteering, visit the <u>PSD Volunteer Website</u> and register to be a volunteer in PSD. Once you are approved, check with your child's teacher for volunteer opportunities.

COVID protocols in PSD for Volunteers

- 1. **Masks are required for all volunteers and visitors** to PSD schools and buildings. Masks are not required outside.
- 2. Self-monitoring for symptoms is required before entering a building.
- 3. Log into the PSD Community Portal when you volunteer or visit.
- 4. Then scan your badge or log in to volunteer.
