Thunderbird Update – March 24, 2022

Dear Johnson Families,

The following guidelines were sent to all PSD families on Monday, March 21st. We've had a lot of questions, so are requesting that you please review them.

The biggest change is that a negative COVID test is required to return to school following any symptom. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we implement these protocols.

This is an update about free COVID tests and the state's new illness guidelines.

What to do when sick: PSD will follow the <u>state health department's new "How Sick is Too Sick" protocols</u>. Neither the state nor PSD will use Return to Learn guidelines anymore.

Have any of the symptoms below? You need a negative COVID test to return to school.

When not related to a documented chronic health condition, symptoms that require a negative test to return to school include fever, feeling feverish, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, cough, sore throat, runny nose, congestion, muscle/body aches, headache, fatigue, new loss of sense of taste or smell.

If your student tests positive or chooses not to test, they must remain home for five days and wear a mask on days 6 to 10 when they return, per public health requirements.

Free tests: PSD is handing out roughly 1,500 free COVID test kits this week. There is a limit of four test kits per vehicle; each kit comes with two iHealth rapid antigen COVID-19 tests. PSD ordered these tests through a free, voluntary state program and is making them available as a public service.

Tests will be available in the parking lots of the following schools until supplies run out:

- 5-7 p.m. Thursday, March 24, Fossil Ridge High School, 5400 Ziegler Road in Fort Collins
- 5-7 p.m. Thursday, March 24, Poudre High School, 201 S. Impala Drive in Fort Collins

Options for exemptions from quarantine: If staff or students are identified as close contacts of a COVID-positive individual and receive quarantine orders from the health department, there are three options for them to remain at school or work. More information >>

- Option 1: Be fully vaccinated with a primary series and boosted, if eligible.
- **Option 2:** Follow all steps of the <u>Test to Stay in PSD program</u>. PSD accepts results from at-home, rapid antigen tests, including iHealth.
- Option 3: Have record of a confirmed positive COVID test in the last 90 days.

Thank you for your continued partnership as we adapt to changing public health conditions and protocols.

Statewide Assessments – CMAS Testing (Grades 3 – 5)

This Spring, all PSD schools will administer statewide assessments, also known as the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS). These tests provide valuable information for our school and teachers, who use the data to understand where students are in their learning and tailor instruction accordingly. The district also uses these results to measure overall student academic progress and identify opportunities for improvement.

Positive Behavior Intervention Support

Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) is our system for teaching and supporting students to make good choices here at school. Our motto is Thunderbird PRIDE: Participate Positively, Respect Everyone, Insist on Safety, Do your Best, Enjoy Learning. Our students understand what PRIDE means in our school, and we reward students' positive choices. This year we are producing monthly PRIDE videos that are shared with students. The school goal of PBIS is to recognize the positive choices that students make throughout the day and to affirm these choices. We want our students to understand appropriate behaviors and to encourage these behaviors through positive reinforcement.

Outdoor Recess Guidelines

As a gentle reminder, Colorado brings ever changing weather. Please make sure your child brings the appropriate gear to go out and play. The children love playing in the snow at recess and have such a great time with this. Our temperature cut point for going out is 10°. We do watch for windchill and factor this in. In other words, if the temperature is 20° but windchill says it feels like 7°, we keep the children inside.
