Principal's Corner

Dear Johnson Families.

April is the month we begin to plan for the following school year. For the 2022-23 school year, we anticipate having two classroom teachers at kindergarten and fourth grade. All other grades will have three teachers.

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Principal's Corner

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One of the most critical and time-consuming tasks for teachers, and for me, during the spring is class placement for the following school year. The procedure we follow to ensure the best classroom environment possible for each child has several steps and takes several meetings. This is a complex process that teachers engage in to form classrooms that are balanced, diverse, and support all learners. Factors that are considered are academic ability, learning style, social and behavioral needs, peer relationships, age, gender, personality, and special needs. Every year, I get a **few** requests for class placement. If you are a family that would like to make a request, you will need to submit your request in writing. Please outline your reasoning for your request. You will need to include academic ability, learning style, social and behavioral needs, peer relationships, age, gender, personality, and/or special need reasons for your request. The deadline for submitting requests is Friday, April 22, 2022. You will need to submit your request to me via email with the email title as Class Placement Request. We truly value parent/guardian input and will make a best effort to honor requests; however, if we have too many requests, we will not be able to meet them all. We will not honor a request for a particular teacher and a friendship request. A family can make one or the other, but not both. Finally, we post class lists in August. Once these lists are posted, we do not make changes to the classrooms as these changes unravel all the work that went into forming the class in the spring.

In closing, thank you for making Johnson a great place to be.



News from PE Land

Hi Thunderbirds,

Here are the upcoming events in the PE Department:

 Johnson 4/5 track and field meet will be April 25. No limitations for events. The top 3 competitors in each event qualify for the PSD meet and can



compete in 2 track events, 1 field event, 1 relay and 1 distance event (limitation rule).

Additionally, 4th-7th place are eligible for the PSD meet for the following reasons:

- 1. limitation rule, see above
- 2. prior commitments by a top finisher

The PSD meet is May 3 for 800meter run and 1600meter run. Main track and field meet is Saturday May 7. 5th grade at 8:00, 4th grade at 10:00.

• Students that want to run the 800meter run (4th) or the 1600meter run (5th) will have opportunities before and after school starting Tuesday, April 5th. These are a time trial format usually 15 minutes per session. The best 3 times qualify like the regular track meet AND THEY MEET THE DISTRICT QUALIFYING TIME.

Three ways to report incidents, concerns in PSD

PSD believes in ensuring all people – students, parents/guardians and staff – are heard and honored in our schools and workplaces. It is important that you report your concerns, and there are three ways to do so through a new web page on PSD's website.

- **Safety concerns:** Report through the <u>Safe2Tell website</u> or call 1-877-542 -7233.
 - ♦ Examples: Threat of harm to others; threat of harm to self; illegal activity.
- Sexual harassment: Report through <u>PSD's Title IX platform</u>.
 - Examples: Sexual harassment or discrimination based on sex and/or gender
- **Negative experience:** Report non-Title IX issues through <u>PSD's Incident</u> Reporting platform.
 - Examples: Discrimination based on culture/ethnicity; bullying; racial or homophobic slander; anti-Semitism

I Matter

<u>I Matter</u> - Every Colorado youth is eligible for three free therapy sessions. Youth and their parents can visit the <u>I Matter platform</u> to take a confidential online survey about their mental health and schedule sessions with a licensed behavioral health clinician, primarily online over telehealth. State law allows youth ages 12 and up to use the platform independently; youth ages 11 and younger will need their parent or guardian's consent to sign up. Learn more on the <u>I Matter website</u>.

School Registration Information

Registration for new students and students returning to PSD

All new and returning K-12 students register at their neighborhood school. You can find your neighborhood school on the <u>School Locator web page</u>.

- Kindergarten students must be five and first-grade students must be six on or before Oct. 1. (<u>Superintendent's Policy JEB</u>). <u>Learn more about kindergarten registration >></u>
- Returning students are students who left PSD and are returning back to a PSD school. Current PSD students do not need to re-register every year to go back to the same school.

Students wishing to attend a school outside their attendance area must submit a School Choice application.

Online registration available for new and returning students

- To enroll new students in a PSD school, please visit the <u>PSD Online</u> Registration web page.
- If you have questions about registration, please call the school your child will be attending.

Registration for PSD students moving to a new school

Current PSD students who are moving to a new school should contact their current school to withdraw and their new school to register. Students moving from elementary to middle school and middle school to high school do not have to contact their schools. Fifth grade students are pre-registered at their neighborhood feeder middle school in February. Contact each middle school for registration details.

ParentVUE - PSD Student Information System

Parents/guardians access grades, attendance, schedules and other student information through the Synergy parent portal. Complete secure login through the ParentVUE/StudentVUE portal or through the apps, which can be downloaded from the ITUNES Store and Google Play.

Parents/guardians can only see their student's information. Parents/guardians must have "educational rights" to access ParentVUE. Once educational rights are reflected in Synergy, parents will receive an email with a user activation code.

Johnson Representative needed for the District Advisory Board

Student Data Verification

We encourage parent/guardians to review and/or update their family and student information. Up to date contact information is important in order to receive communication from Johnson and Poudre School District. Updates can now be completed through ParentVUE. Once you log into ParentVUE, click on the Online Registration tab on the top right corner of the screen:



Then, select 2021-2022 Family and Student Data Verification from the drop-down menu:



If applicable, parents can upload a proof of address and updated immunization record.
