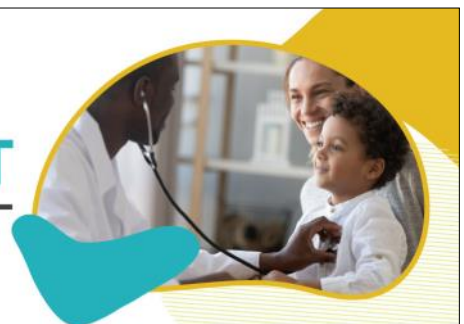

PSD now accepting Bus Requests for the 2022-23 School year



Poudre School District aims to transport as many students as possible to and from school. To ensure that families needing transportation receive this service, **riders must now apply for busing each year, even if they've had busing before.**

Families may request transportation [online here](#). Submitting a request is not a guarantee of services. Even with ongoing recruiting efforts and the hiring of additional bus operators, PSD is still busing fewer students than in previous years because of a reduction in routes due to the ongoing driver shortage.

What you need to know when submitting a request

- Transportation will be provided automatically to all students who qualify for transportation through the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), the McKinney-Vento program, or foster placement. Students who meet these criteria need NOT apply.
- Busing is NOT provided for students who attend a school of choice or PSD-authorized charter school. If your student is eligible for busing at their neighborhood school but is switching to a school of choice, they will not receive busing.
- Alternate bus requests will not be accepted for [students in the walk area](#) or for multiple addresses.
- PSD is opening the new Wellington and Timnath middle/high schools in August.
 - ◇ Incoming freshmen and sophomores who currently attend Poudre High School or Fossil Ridge High School but live in the Wellington or Timnath attendance areas will not be eligible for busing to Poudre or Fossil.

After you submit a request

- Families will be notified around the week before school starts if their student is scheduled to receive busing starting the first day of the 2022-23 school year.
- Bus-eligible requests submitted by July 15 should be ready for the start of school. Bus-eligible requests submitted after July 15 may not be approved until after the first day of school.
- Students who do not ride their assigned bus for two consecutive weeks may be removed from the bus route to make space for other eligible students.

From the Health Office – End of Year Medication Pickup



Medications cannot be sent home with students at the end of the school year.

- Parents must pick up all medications on or before the last day of school. Medications must be picked up by the end of the school day (noon).
- If medications need to be picked up before the last day of school, make arrangements with the school nurse or health tech.
- Emergency or as-needed medications (Epi-pens, Tylenol, Inhalers, etc.) must also be picked up.
- The school nurse will follow state health department procedures and all medications not picked up will be disposed of properly.
- If medications will be brought back to the school in the fall, you may obtain a medical permission form from the health tech in your school, or on the PSD website.

[I Matter](#) - Every Colorado youth is eligible for three free therapy sessions. Youth and their parents can visit the [I Matter platform](#) to take a confidential online survey about their mental health and schedule sessions with a licensed behavioral health clinician, primarily online over telehealth. ParentVUE - PSD Student Information System

Parents/guardians access grades, attendance, schedules and other student information through the Synergy parent portal. Complete secure login through the [ParentVUE/StudentVUE portal](#) or through the apps, which can be downloaded from the [iTunes Store](#) and [Google Play](#).

Parents/guardians can only see their student's information. Parents/guardians must have "educational rights" to access ParentVUE. Once educational rights are reflected in Synergy, parents will receive an email with a user activation code.

School Registration Information

Registration for kindergarten is now open, [start here](#).

Kindergarten is an exciting and important first step on your student's educational journey. In PSD, you'll find students are supported in many ways with caring teachers and staff, positive school, and classroom culture, as well as a collaborative, safe and welcoming learning environment.



Kindergarten offers:

- Small class sizes
- Structured, rigorous, play-based curriculum
- Kindergarten is free
- Social and emotional learning experiences

Children must be 5 years old on or before Oct. 1, 2022, to be registered for kindergarten in the 2022-23 school year.

All new and returning K-12 students register at their neighborhood school. You can find your neighborhood school on the [School Locator web page](#).

- Returning students are students who left PSD and are returning back to a PSD school. **Current PSD students do not need to re-register every year to go back to the same school.**

Students wishing to attend a school outside their attendance area must submit a [School Choice application](#).

- If you have questions about registration, please call the school your child will be attending.

Registration for PSD students moving to a new school

Current PSD students who are moving to a new school should contact their current school to withdraw and their new school to register. Students moving from elementary to middle school and middle school to high school do not have to contact their schools. Fifth grade students are pre-registered at their neighborhood feeder middle school in February. Contact each middle school for registration details.

Student Data Verification

We encourage parent/guardians to review and/or update their family and student information. Up to date contact information is important in order to receive communication from Johnson and Poudre School District. Updates can now be completed through ParentVUE. Once you log into ParentVUE, click on the Online Registration tab on the top right corner of the screen:



Then, select 2021-2022 Family and Student Data Verification from the drop-down menu:



If applicable, parents can upload a proof of address and updated immunization record.
