Our second major improvement strategy targets student belonging and well being with improving our system of response for social emotional learning and behavioral needs. Our staff are engaged in being a responsive school system.

Our specials staff have incorporated executive functioning skills during their time with students and in support of our overall academics. During the month of September, our specials staff presented lessons on self-control with the character "Stop-a-Tron." Stop-a-Tron teaches us to stop and think before acting. The focus for October was "Sustain-O the Great." Sustain-O the Great teaches us to attend to a situation or task despite distractibility, being tired, or having a lack of interest. For November, students will study flexibility with the character "Flexi Lexi." Flexi Lexi teaches us to be adaptable to changing situations.

AM Drop-offs and PM Pick-ups

Seeing students walk or ride a scooter or bike to school is so encouraging. The nice Fall weather has been a big help with this, but now as the weather gets colder, our morning drop-offs and afternoon pick-ups in the carline will get busier with more vehicles, and so we want to send out a quick reminder for parents to take an extra breath and Insist on Safety as you enter our school drop off lane and parking area. Please remember that the lane closest to the school building is reserved for buses, and school/district personnel. Also be aware that we have two lanes that funnel into the school parking lot. The left lane is if you plan to park, and the right lane is for drop offs. Students should exit on the right side of the vehicle and use the safety sidewalk. It also really helps with traffic flow when vehicles move all the way forward in the drop off lane. It is a win-win to move all the way down the carline, as your child will get more steps and more cars will move through the morning and afternoon traffic. School Of Choice

Some Things have Changed!

- We have a new platform to submit school choice application
- The timeline for first round is now Nov.1 Dec. 15
- Parent/legal guardian now has five business days to respond to a seat offer and can be notified not only by email but also by phone and/or text
- Seat offers not responded to within five business days are marked as declined
 - ♦ If a seat is declined, the student is removed from the waitlist and will not be offered a seat again.
 - More information will be provided about seat offers process as we continue the implementation process with our new platform
- If a student with a sibling is offered a seat and accepts it, the sibling
 (s) still on the waitlist will change to be a sibling priority ranking (#2
 or #6)
- The system no longer allows applications to be renewed in order to keep current waitlist placement

School Choice Acceptance, Eligibility and Transportation

PSD's K-12 school choice program allows families to select the school they feel best meets their child's educational needs. Acceptance is subjected to space availability and eligibility requirements. Submitting a school choice application does not guarantee enrollment at any school applied for.

- Centennial High School and Poudre Community Academy are alternative schools that use separate application process; therefore, the school choice application process is not applicable for these schools. Contact those schools directly for more information.
- Charter Schools operate independently from PSD and have their own school choice process. Please contact the charter schools directly about school choice.
- Round-trip transportation is the responsibility of the parent/legal guardian for School Choice students. For more information: <u>District</u> <u>Policy JFBA Choice/Open/Enrollment</u> I <u>PSD Transportation website</u>.

Kindergarten and School Choice

Parent/legal guardians must <u>register</u> students entering kindergarten at their designated <u>neighborhood school</u>, even if an application is pending for choice/ open enrollment. Please refer to <u>District Policy JEB</u> for age requirements for kindergarten is PSD.

- Registering at the designated neighborhood school does not impact a pending school choice application or potential seat offers from a choice school or program.
- The <u>online registration process</u> for the 2023-24 school year will be available for parents/legal guardians beginning Monday, Nov. 28, to register their incoming kindergartener.

- In-person registration is also available for families at neighborhood elementary schools on Wednesday, Dec. 7. Contact your student's neighborhood school for school hours.
- Parents/legal guardians of incoming kindergarteners should complete online or in-person registration by Wednesday, Dec. 7, to allow schools to determine their classroom sizes, staffing needs and the number of school choice seats they can offer.
- Online registration will still be available for families throughout the rest of the year.

Johnson Parent Handbook

The Johnson Parent Handbook for the 2022-2023 School Year is available on the <u>Johnson website</u> under the "About Us" Tab.

The purpose of the handbook is to provide information regarding Johnson Elementary School, as well as our school's rules and procedures in an "easy to access" format. We encourage you to read it, keep it on hand to refer to it, and let us know if you need any clarification.

Poudre School District policies and regulations (including but not limited to those in the <u>District's Student Rights & Code of Conduct booklet</u>) also apply to Johnson Elementary School and are controlling over our rules and procedures if there is any inconsistency or conflict. Although this handbook may reference certain District policies and regulations, the actual language of the reference policies and regulations change over time. AlphaBEST – Before and After School Childcare

AlphaBEST Education offers before and after school childcare services to students here at Johnson.

Hours of operation

- Before-school programs will run 630am until the first bell Mondays through Fridays.
- After-School programs will operate from the time of dismissal until 6pm
- AlphaBEST will align with PSD decisions about opening, delayed start and school closures due to emergencies and inclement weather.
 AlphaBEST will be closed on most days when PSD is closed. Full-day care will be available at a PSD site on teacher workdays.
